

July 9, 2014

The regular monthly meeting of the Oxford Board of Port Wardens was called to order by the chairman, Thomas Campbell, on Wednesday, July 9, 2014, at 7 p.m., in the meeting room of the Oxford Community Services Building.

The only other member in attendance was Larry Murray.

The minutes of May 1, 2014 and June 5, 2014 were approved and accepted as distributed.

A maintenance application for John and Mary Yerrick, property owners of 107 Pleasant Street, was reviewed. The request called for rip-rap repair. No one was present to explain the application. Mr. Murray expressed concern as to how the contractor, Bridges Land Management, would be bringing in the new rip-rap material. If the materials were being brought in from the water, there would be no problem. However, Mr. Murray felt a note should be written to the contractor to pay attention to the site and if the materials were going to be brought in by land, they should have a soil and sediment plan in place and to stay away from the town property at the end of Pleasant Street. Mr. Murray made a motion that if the contractor can assure the town office that they will take all appropriate measures to keep any erosion or sediment from entering the river, than the Port Wardens would be in favor the work proposed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell and unanimously carried.

Old Business

Mr. Campbell stated that all the moorings have been accounted for except for one. Captain Thomas Bixler, who was in the audience, thanked Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer Cheryl Lewis for all her work in handling the mooring situation.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
