America will be installed in St. Paul's Church and will run from October 29th to December 16th, Friday through Monday, from 10 am to 4 pm.



MyCoast Maryland: Documenting Flooding in Oxford


It's a well-known fact that Oxford floods, and it's also well known that the Town of Oxford is a passionate community that cares about protecting families and friends. You probably have a lot of flooding photos, but what do you do with them? Downloading the **MyCoast Maryland** app could be your solution. **MyCoast Maryland** is a photo-based community science app and website that collects information through community reports and allows users to visualize flood impacts in Maryland. The Maryland Department of Natural Resource's Chesapeake & Coastal Service supports MyCoast Maryland and **we need your help to document flooding in Oxford!**

The MyCoast app is available in the App Store and Google Play and is easy to use. After making an account, take a photo of flooding using your phone. Next, MyCoast uses your location to retrieve weather and tide information to add context to your photo of flooding. Once your information is submitted the report will appear on the report map for other users to view.

Here's an example of a flooding report from the October 29th flood event in 2021:

This flooding reports shows how MyCoast ties tide data to the photo's location and time. The graph at the bottom right shows the observed water level was much higher than the predicted water level - valuable information for documenting evidence of increasing flood levels. When a photo is submitted through email, it strips the time and location data, which is critical information we need to target flooding areas. MyCoast is an excellent solution for collecting flood data that can be referenced by a wide audience and replaces emailing photos of flooding to community members or posting photos to a social media account.

This app empowers community members to collect flooding data in real time and provides a tool for others to view the shared data. The tool provides a platform for visualizing flooding impact, enhances awareness, and encourages action to reduce flood risks. MyCoast can reflect a community that's involved and active in flood data collection and can be used to support grant applications.

The MyCoast app and webpage can also be used to select a tide station and view daily tide data. The webpage highlights when our region is likely to experience high tide flooding so you can plan for predicted higher flood levels. Higher than normal tides are predicted for our area on October 9 - 12, October 26 - 29, and November 24 - 26. Download the MyCoast app and help us document high tide flooding.
