Oxford Commissioner Gordon Graves was an iconic supporter of his beloved community. His service to the Town of Oxford not only involved his nine plus years as an elected official serving the citizens of Oxford, it also encompassed his love of history, education and people, as he spent the last 20 years of his life in daily community service supporting the Oxford Museum, the Oxford Community Center, the Oxford Business Association and Habitat for Humanity, along with involvement in endless smaller projects in support of the town he called his home. He spent his entire professional career in higher education. His love of learning and years of service make this scholarship in support of local student's educational pursuits a fitting legacy.

Purpose: Provide local students with scholarships to be utilized for acquisition of necessary books and supplies while pursuing their post high school education.

- **Open to all public/private school students currently or recently attending high school in Talbot County**
- **Applications must demonstrate the applicant's efforts in the area of community service**
- **At least one grant for no less than \$500 will be awarded to a chosen student annually**
- **No less than \$500 for award will be included in the Oxford General Budget annually**
- **Funding of additional grants is open to any party or group interested in creating a donation in Gordon's name and wishing to support the efforts of local students**

Internal process:

- **The annual award will be budgeted and disbursed within normal General Budget bookkeeping**
- **An individual savings account will be utilized for any outside funds received**
- **A simple application will be prepared and posted on the town website with an annual due date**
- **Applicants will be reviewed by staff and submitted to the Commissioners with recommendation**
- **Awardees will provide documentation of purchases in coordination with the staff**
