From the Commissioners:

Welcome to our new Planner, Marilyn Williams. Marilyn comes to us from Wicomico County Planning, has extensive experience in planning and zoning, is a Certified Floodplain Manager, and has experience with FEMA funded projects.

Strand Beach Living Shoreline Improvements: planting is anticipated in April, the remaining improvements will be scheduled outside of the summer season.

Dugout Memorial Park. Acquisition of park elements is underway, a workshop is planned for anyone that would like to participate in the layout and discuss opportunities for memorials. Date and time to be posted on the town website.

Stormwater Management Improvements. Following engineering review and recommendations, the Commissioners are currently reviewing proposed improvements to manage stormwater and mitigate tidal flooding in several areas in town, and anticipate identifying two or more projects to be constructed in the near future.

Following an MDOT Kim Lamphier Bikeways Network Program Grant Award, Talbot Thrive is working on the design of the "Oyster Trail" - an Oxford Park Connector providing a shared use path from the Causeway Park, through Dugout Memorial Park and onto the Talbot County Conservation Park. With a grant from the National Garden Club's Plant America Program, the **Oxford Garden Club** undertook the design and planting of a low maintenance garden in the town's Bank Street Park, planting an over 300 sq. ft. area in the spring of 2023.
